International commitments around TB and gender

- Gender as a critical dimension for understanding and responding to TB
 - The political declaration from the UNHLM on TB makes clear reference to the need for gender equality and social inclusion
 - A Deadly Divide: TB Commitments vs. TB Realities also emphasizes the need to further strengthen efforts to realize a gender transformative TB response

Evidence from TB CRG Assessment work

- Twenty TB CRG Assessments have now been completed
- Key results revealed a lack of understanding about the relevance of gender for TB – extending beyond prevalence to understand the barriers experienced on the basis of gender.
- Too few supportive and enabling laws and policies to protect human rights and ensure gender-transformative approaches exist
- TB-related stigma was also found to be high
- Further meaningful engagement of vulnerable and marginalized TB key populations, including women, in TB policy and programming was recommended
