## **Origins: PCB NGO call to translate commitments into action**

Established following PCB NGO call to bridge gap between country commitments & action to end HIVrelated stigma & discrimination. Launched 1 year later on Human Rights Day (10 December 2018).

- Translate political & human rights commitments into country action on eliminating S&D;
- Revitalize and strengthen synergies & partnerships among stakeholders to implement & scale up these programs
- Senerate and disseminate evidence-based data to inform policy & programming, measure progress, and support accountability

### **Country Commitments**

- Partner with CSOs, people being left behind, UN & donors to 1) identify policy & programme gaps, design & implement evidenceinformed interventions, and track progress in eliminating HIVrelated stigma & discrimination.
- Assess current state of HIV-related stigma & discrimination to 2) identify & implement programmes to eliminate barriers to services.

Take actions on eliminating HIV-related stigma & discrimination in six settings over 5 years; commit to 3 settings in first year;

Allocate resources to support implementation, monitoring & reporting of interventions to eliminate HIV-related stigma & discrimination

Monitor and report annually on progress using existing and recommended indicators



# Impact on the ground

Catalytic Technical Support: Regional and country coordinators accelerate the implementation of (and advocacy around) the GP to achieve the societal enablers targets leading to:

#### Strong collaboration at regional and national level:

- > Jamaica: multisectoral and high-level commitment led to operational plan to remove HIV-related human rights barriers & M&E model and score card
- > WCA: Shared experiences and knowledge led to streamlined processes/models of national action plans
- **Improved Legal Environments:** Adoption and dissemination of new enabling documents and/or work and advocacy for repelling discriminatory ones
  - > CAR's National Charter for Quality of Care and Patients' Rights
  - Iran's health law  $\geq$
  - Support to communities Ghana's anti-LGBTQ bill

**Targeted Synergies:** Alignment with existing grants/processes to ensure resources are made available for human rights and societal enablers programming

# Impact on the ground continued

**Capacitated Advocates**: Communities can meaningfully engage with national/international entities for their rights and/or to advocate for law reform

- #MoreThan campaign and Community Engagement Strategy  $\succ$
- Joint civil society/governmental platform in Ukraine on HIV criminalization

#### **Capacitated actors:**

- Iran: health workers trained in ensuring accessible HIV services in emergency settings
- Uganda: healthcare workers trained on human rights-based approaches to HIV & SRHR services

#### Mechanisms addressing human right violations in place

- Thailand: National Code of Conduct on HIV prevention & management in workplace
- Kazakhstan: website for data collection on real-time human rights violations of PLHIV & KPs
