	Create linkages with and build the capacity of community-led and community-based organisations and networks to impart legal information and conduct advocacy for improvements for those who are at risk of or have experienced violence as a result of COVID-19
	Grants to support community members who are not eligible to access government COVID-19 relief fund
	Train duty-bearers in the justice system (police officers, lay magistrates, court staff) on providing a responsive and human-rights based approach to service delivery so as reduce barriers to access justice for women who have experienced intimate partner and gender-based violence as a result of COVID-19
