WHY USE DATA FOR ADVOCACY?

The Country Coordinating Mechanism (CCM)

- Conducts oversight of grant implementation and performance

CCMs are **required to include representatives** who are members of communities and key populations. Communities must be consulted throughout the grant cycle.

WHY USE DATA FOR ADVOCACY?

When advocating to the CCM, using data is important in order to:

1. Make your advocacy messages stronger: quantitative data can be seen as **more believable** than personal stories

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3. Reveal the underlying cause of challenges you are seeing in real life: data let you look at trends and patterns that explain what is happening
4. **Ask the right questions !**

WHY USE DATA FOR ADVOCACY?

Scenario: Your country is submitting the Funding Request for Grant Cycle 8

“We need more funding for community-based PrEP programs for sex workers.”

“We need more funding for community-based PrEP programs for sex workers.

In Grant Cycle 7, there was a **50% cut** to the intervention “Pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) programing for sex workers”, from **\$50,000 to \$25,000**. Yet the program **achieves its targets**. We need to restore higher funding levels in GC8.”

WHY USE DATA FOR ADVOCACY?

Scenario: Your CCM is selecting the Principal Recipients for Grant Cycle 8

“We would like for the local, civil society PR to take over the implementation of TB prevention activities from the iNGO.”

“We would like for the local, civil society PR to take over the implementation of TB prevention activities from the iNGO.

Last cycle, the iNGO’s grant **spent only 42%** of the total budget, and **only 26%** of the TB prevention budget. The local PR has **85% performance** against its targets and is known and trusted by communities.

WHY USE DATA FOR ADVOCACY?

Scenario: Your CCM is reviewing PR performance for Grant Cycle 7 grants

“The government has not done a good job serving communities.”

“The government has not done a good job serving communities.

Among the four PRs, the government PR has the **reached only 45%** of its targets for KP programs. Every cycle since GC5, the government PR’s performance has **only gotten worse**. We need commitments and change.”

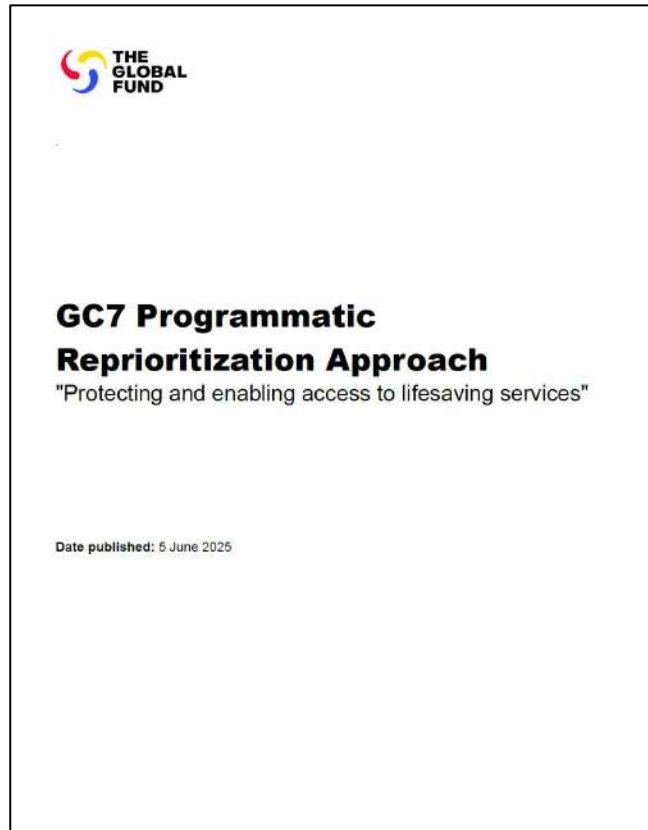
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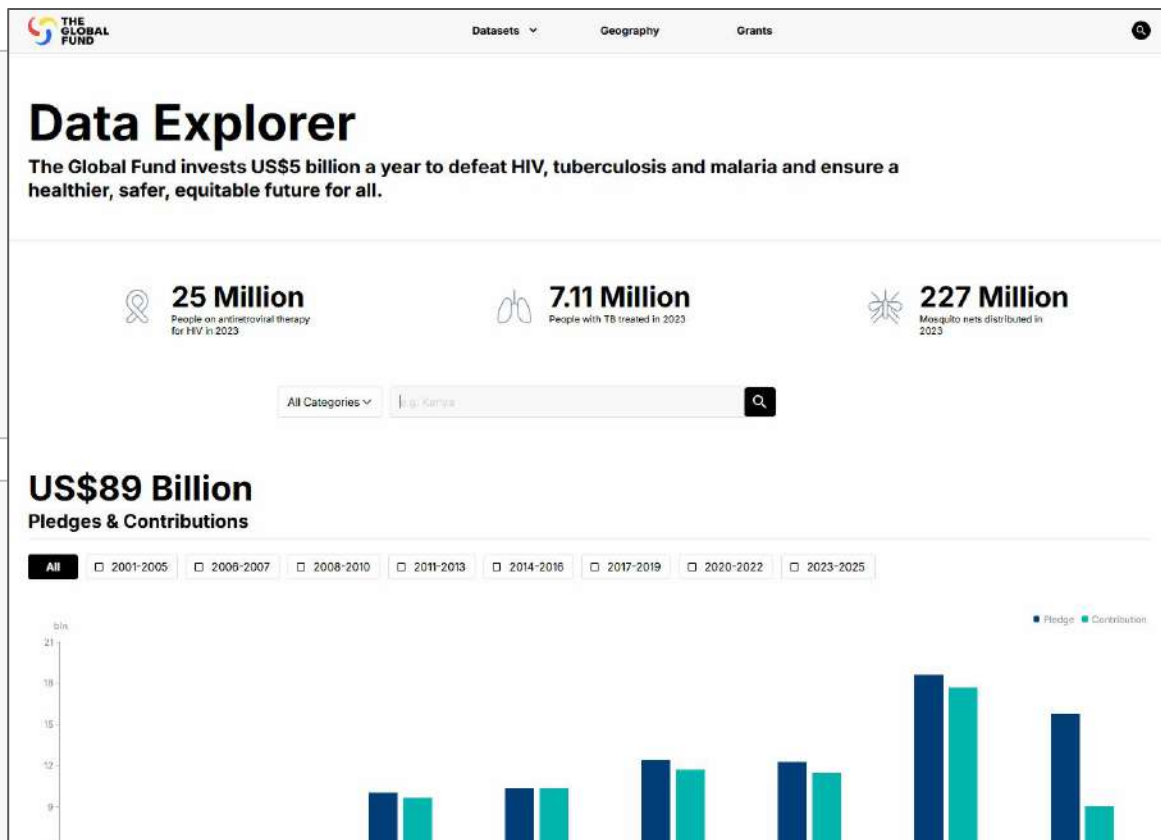
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

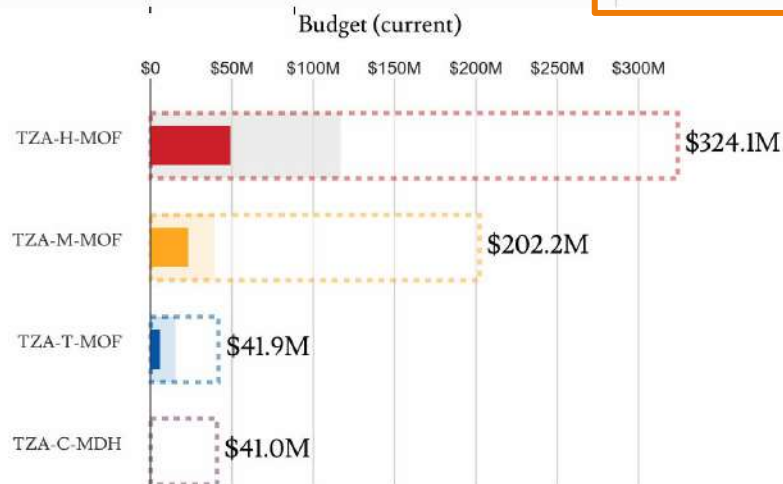

KEY RESOURCES to understand and navigate the Global Fund's GC7 adaptation processes

On 25 April, the Global Fund Secretariat guided Principal Recipients about the need to 'slow down' the expenditure of Global Fund grants for certain activities. On 16 May, the Secretariat released guidance about additional grant adaptation measures for Grant Cycle 7 (GC7). This guidance is focused on the need to deallocate funds from certain grant portfolios, to reprioritize activities for the remainder of GC7, and to process grant revisions, as needed.

Here you'll find key resources and documents to support advocates in navigating these ongoing changes, with a focus on ensuring that gender-transformative, community-led responses remain a priority. This collection includes official Global Fund materials, partner-developed resources, and tailored W4GF documents, all designed to guide advocacy and engagement throughout this critical moment—so that the shift in priorities does not come at the expense of health equity and rights.

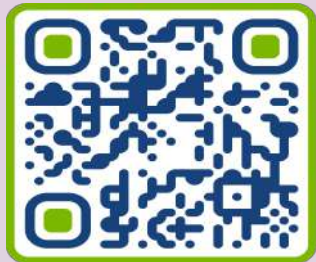
