WHO ARE WE?

OUR MISSION

W4GF Brings together women's advocates to advance gender equality through the Global Fund to fight HIV, TB, Malaria.

We aim to strengthen women's participation in decision-making at global and national levels, ensure their voices hold the Global Fund accountable for advancing gender equality.

We are 327 advocates spanning 75 countries





WHAT DO WE MEAN BY WOMEN IN ALL OF OUR DIVERSITY

Diversity is our strength. We embrace all women, including those living with HIV, affected by TB or malaria, LGBTQIA+ individuals, women who use drugs, sex workers (18+), adolescents, Indigenous women, migrants, refugees, the incarcerated, and women with visible or invisible disabilities.





WHAT WE DO

For W4GF, meaningful participation means ensuring diverse women and girls are actively involved in decision-making that affects their lives.

This means the power to influence policies and strategies, ensuring equal, informed, and representative participation that shapes responses to eliminate stigma and discrimination.





A YEAR OF CRITICAL ADVOCACY AMID CHALLENGES

Human Rights Rollbacks

Alarming rollbacks in human rights observed in regions like Uganda, Afghanistan, and parts of the MENA region.

Escalation of gender-based violence, compounded by a lack of protective policies and frameworks.

Impact of COVID-19 Recovery

Recovery efforts diverted attention from critical services for women and girls.

Insufficient resource allocation has resulted in underfunded gender-transformative health programs.

Key Advocacy Priorities for 2024

Strengthening capacity for gender-transformative health programming.

Tackling stigma, discrimination, and systemic barriers to equitable access.



REGIONAL EXPANSION AND MENTORSHIPS

- Launched two regional hubs (Latin America & MENA), adding 48 advocates.
- Conducted mentorships in Zambia, MENA, and Ecuador, gathering women's needs and sharing strategies for gender-transformative Global Fund engagement.
- Presented W4GF advocacy and gender-transformative health benefits to NYU students.






We achieved **18** collaborations in social media and partner with **25** organisations.

Reached 10,449 people through our social media channels, averaging 870 engagements per month.

Our seminars, workshops, and online meetings attracted 423 participants, with November and December marking the highest attendance.

We developed 9 statements and call to actions signed by 221 people


